Wagga Wagga Base Hospital Multi-storey Car Park

Installation and erection of tower crane on Saturday 28 May 2022

The NSW Government has committed \$30 million to the Wagga Wagga Base Hospital Multi-storey Car Park project to deliver additional parking for patients, visitors and staff.

Work on the project is continuing as planned with the installation and erection of a tower crane to assist with the construction of the multi-storey car park. We have included a map to show you the location of the work.

The installation of the crane will take place between **7.00am and 5.00pm on Saturday 28 May 2022**, which is within approved construction work times.

The crane is expected to be in place until late 2022 and will operate within approved construction hours for the duration.

Construction of the multi-storey car park started in mid-2021 and is expected to be completed by the end of 2022 with over 900 parking spaces on the Wagga Wagga Base Hospital campus.

How will the work affect you?

We recognise that building new infrastructure can be disruptive to nearby residents, businesses and road users. All construction activities are carried out with the health and safety of the local community as our top priority.

The installation and erection of the tower crane will occur on Lewis Drive, directly outside the current work site of the multi-storey car park. It will affect the entrance, roadway, car parks and footpath surrounding this area as follows:

- Section of Lewis Drive closed with detours in place through 1-hour car park
- 1-hour car park closed for parking, except for disabled access parking

Access to the Emergency Department will be maintained at all times.

Traffic changes will be managed with appropriate traffic control in place for pedestrians and vehicles. Additional signage will be placed on Edward Street and Murray Street alerting traffic to the changes. For your safety, please follow the directions of traffic controllers at all times.

Once the tower crane is installed and erected, it will operate in approved construction hours and will only carry loads within the work site and loading area. The crane will be shut down after hours, with lights operating as per Aviation Flyer rules. When not in operation, the arm of the crane will swing in the direction of the prevailing wind. This is known as 'weathervaning' and is safe and normal.

We endeavour to keep noise, dust and vibration to a minimum and will make every effort to minimise impacts.
