



ARTIST'S IMPRESSION

The NSW Government is investing \$30 million in the construction of a new multi-storey car park and two street-level car parks on the Wagga Wagga Base Hospital campus for patients, visitors and staff.

The Wagga Wagga Base Hospital Multi-storey Car Park project will deliver more than 900 parking spaces on the campus.

Project Update

Both the Docker Street car park and the multi-storey car park projects are progressing well. The piling works for the multi-storey car park will be completed late 2021. Demolition works to the Docker Street car park are ongoing with the Dental Building removal and the ongoing works to demolish Lewis House.

Edward and Yabtree Street - Multi-storey car park

Site works for the multi-storey car park are underway and the car park will reach its first milestone by the end of 2021 with the completion of the piling. With all site establishment and piling works complete, upcoming works on this site include:

- In ground services relocations.
- Commencement of multi-storey car park floor slabs.
- Internal works to the car park will continue.

Docker Street

Upcoming works include:

- Continued demolition.
- Carpark earthworks and pavement works.
- Surrounding footpath and landscaping works.

These works to the Docker Street car park are expected to be complete in early 2022.

Yathong Street car park - now open

There are now 81 new street level car spaces available to staff on Yathong Street with Phase One completed. The project is being delivered in three phases to minimise the loss of parking during construction and to allow new car parking spaces to become available as works progress.

Safety measures

Prior site investigations have indicated that bonded asbestos exists in the excavated ground areas, and removal of that material is required. All work will be conducted in accordance with the Department's Asbestos Management Plan, the Contractor's Demolition Management Plan and Safe Work NSW requirements. Safety measures have been put in place to ensure there is no risk to patients, visitors, staff, neighbours or the local community. The area has been secured and appropriate controls are installed and all asbestos-containing material will be removed by a licensed asbestos removal contractor. The health, safety and well-being of patients, visitors, staff, neighbours and the local community is our highest priority.



Working hours

Working hours are Monday to Friday, 7:00am - 6:00pm, Saturdays 8:00am - 1:00pm. No work will occur on Sundays or Public Holidays, unless otherwise advised. All work will be within NSW Government's Public Health Orders and relevant COVID restrictions. **Construction will cease for the Christmas break on 24 December 2021 and recommence on 4 January 2022.**

Traffic management

We are working with our contractors to implement strategies that minimise disruption to nearby residents and businesses. Temporary pedestrian diversions and traffic management continue to be in place while these works are underway.
